

DEPARTMENT 004 – SHEEP

Fair Year: 2019

Entries must be made by July 31 of exhibit year.
Open to youth enrolled in the 4-H Sheep project or youth of other groups doing equivalent work.

Judging will be on Friday beginning at 12:00 noon.

Note: Market Animal Sale requirements are listed in a separate document.

No hay or bedding may be stored in the barns.

Rules Governing Sheep Exhibits

- a. All rams must be purebred.
- b. In the Junior Fair, all breeding classes of sheep, registered Columbias, Corriedales, Rambouillets, and Tarchees (wool breeds) shall be shown with 2 inches of wool or less. All other breeds (meat breeds) shall have been completely shorn between 2 months and 2 weeks of show date.
- c. All market entries show with no more than $\frac{3}{8}$ inch of wool.
- d. Sheep shown in the Junior Fair are not eligible for Open Class.
- e. The Danish system of judging will be used.
- f. There must be competition for champion ribbons.
- g. A spring lamb is one born on or after February 16 of the exhibit year.
- h. A winter lamb is one born between January 1 and February 15 of the exhibit year.
- i. A fall lamb is one born during the period between September 1 and December 31 of the preceding exhibit year.
- j. A yearling ram or ewe is one born prior to September 1 of the preceding exhibit year. The age of yearling may be subject to verification by a veterinarian examination whose findings shall be final.
- k. A junior division pair of lambs may include two lambs of any age and either sex.
- l. A junior division flock shall consist of 3 animals: a ram (yearling or lamb); a ewe lamb; and a yearling ewe owned by the exhibitor.
- m. A pen of market lambs shall consist of 2 lambs, wethers or ewes, which are owned by the exhibitor.

DIVISION 36 – SHOWMANSHIP (Sheep)

Entry must be on entry blank. Exhibitors must show their own animals in showmanship classes. (Grade just completed.)

Class No. Premiums: \$3.00 - \$2.50 - \$2.00 - \$1.50

1. Grades 3-6
2. Grades 7-9
3. Grades 10 and above

Show a Sheep Class – no pre-registration necessary. This class is for any sheep exhibitor, who is unable to show their own animal. They may show another exhibitor's animal.

DIVISION 37 – SHEEP LEAD CLASS

Open to any boy or girl and will not require an entry prior to the fair. Exhibitors will have the sheep they wish to show in this special class trained to lead and show at halter. Exhibitors in this class need not be sheep project members.

Rules:

1. Entrants must wear at least one piece of clothing made of wool fabric.
2. The class will be judged on percentages as follows.
 - a. 40% on sheep and manner in which it is handled.
 - b. 30% on wool attire of exhibitor.
 - c. 30% on personality and showmanship of exhibitor.

*** Ribbons will be awarded to all entrants.

Sheep Herdsman/Barn Award

1. Courteousness of exhibitors and attendants.
2. The cleanliness and neatness at all times of livestock and premises and the care and management of feed and storage and waste disposal.
3. Identification of individual animals and their exhibitor.
