DIVISION 170 – CLOVERBUDS

Open to youth enrolled in the 4-H Cloverbud project (K5-2nd grade).
Exhibits will be evaluated and will receive participation ribbons.
Maximum of four (4) entries in different class numbers.
All entries should be created or grown by member.
Poster size: 14"x22", unless noted. Tri-fold displays are not allowed.

Class No. Premiums: \$1.50 per entry

1. Poster of any animal; identify and indicate care needed
2. Display of 4 different garden vegetables
3. Display of 4 cut flowers
4. Potted plant grown by member
5. Simple nature display (insects, leaves, flowers, etc.)
6. Drawing or painting exhibit – mounted on poster board (no frames or glass)
7. Clay modeling or design (display in box)
8. Simple craft project (kit)
9. Simple craft project (no kit)
10. Homemade musical instrument
11. Homemade puppet
12. Photography display – 3 pictures mounted, 11"x14" poster
13. Simple woodworking project
14. Simple electricity project
15. Simple aerospace project
16. Simple scale model kit (Legos, K-NEX, etc.), maximum size: 1' x 1' x 1' (display in box or mounted on platform)
17. Plate of 3 cookies, bars or healthy snack you helped make – on **disposable plate**, covered with Ziplock bag (note all food items are discarded at the end of the fair)
18. Simple sewn item
19. Simple crochet or knitting item
20. First aid kit
21. Agriculture Awareness poster - Topic:
2019: "How does goat milk differ from cow milk?"
2020: "Did you know that cows give us?"
22. Any other non-animal entry related to your project

DIVISION 171 - EXPLORING

Open to youth enrolled in the 4-H Exploring project (Grades 3-5).
The 4-H Exploring project is meant to help members explore projects they are not already enrolled in. Therefore, exhibitors may ONLY enter Exploring entries for projects they are not already enrolled.

Maximum of four (4) entries in different class numbers.

All entries should be created or grown by member.

Poster size: 14"x22". Tri-fold displays are not allowed.

1. Rabbit or poultry – must be entered and judged under Dept. 007, Poultry Pet Class or Dept. 008, Rabbit Pet Class – These animals will be housed in the rabbit building during the fair.
