

Entries must be made by July 31 of exhibit year.

One entry permitted in each class number. All entries must be in place by 10:00 a.m. Friday. Liquor and soda bottles used as containers are not acceptable.

All flowers entered must be locally grown, not florist material. Flower colors may not be altered.

Exhibitors are limited to a maximum of twenty five (25) entries in Department 115. If more than 25 Dept. OC 115 entries are listed on the entry blank, only the first 25 will be entered into the computer. The remaining Dept. OC 115 entries will not be accepted. However, the exhibitor is only allowed to bring 20 exhibits in Dept. OC115 to the fair to be judged.

One spike per color class.

DIVISION 453–ARTISTIC ARRANGEMENTS (Floral)

All arrangements are to consist of fresh cut material except as noted. No artificial flowers may be used, except as noted.

All flowers used in arrangements must be locally grown, not florist material, except for Class No. 29-31.

An arrangement of flowers should include foliage. Flower colors may not be altered.

Arrangements should be stabilized with floral foam, wire, etc.

Premiums: \$3.00–\$2.50–\$2.00–\$1.50

2. "Center of Attention" centerpiece arrangement for a dining table
3. "Candlelight" arrangement of flowers with candles
4. Corsage - fresh only

DIVISION 454–HOUSE PLANTS

Plants are to be free of insects and diseases and must be clean, without additional shine.

Houseplants in a container over 10" in diameter will not be accepted.

"Any other" must be correctly identified.
