

DEPARTMENT 005 – GOATS

Fair Year: 2022

Entries must be made by July 31 of exhibit year.

Open to youth enrolled in the 4-H Goat project or youth of other groups doing equivalent work.

Judging will be on Saturday at approximately 3:00 pm, after the Dairy Show

All exhibitors: See Animal Health Regulations for Fairs and Shows in Wisconsin.

- a. A junior kid is one born on or after April 1 of exhibit year.
- b. A senior kid is one born during the period between January 1 to March 31 of exhibit year.
- c. A junior yearling is one born during the period July 1 to December 31 of the year preceding exhibit year.
- d. A senior yearling is a dry doe born before July 1 of the year preceding exhibit year and less than 24 months of age.

The above does must never have freshened. Does that have freshened, including dry milkers shall be shown in the following classes.

Does 24 months of age and over that have never freshened may not be shown.

Age of following shall be determined as of the opening date of the fair.

- e. A milking yearling, under 2 years.
- f. Doe, two years old; over two years and under 3 years of age.
- g. 3-5 year old doe; is over two years and under 5 years of age.
- h. An aged doe over five years.

All dairy goats need to be clipped for show. None can be shown with horns. Only Pygmy goats may be shown with horns and do not have to be clipped since they are not a dairy breed. No bucks may be shown.

1. Junior kid.....5-4-3-2
2. Senior kid.....5-4-3-2
3. Junior yearling5-4-3-2
4. Senior yearling.....5-4-3-2
(above animals shall never have freshened)
5. Best junior doe.....Ribbon
6. Yearling milker under 2 years of age and in milk.....6-5-4-3
7. Junior milker 2 years but under 3 years.....6-5-4-3
8. Mature milker 3 years but under 5 years.....6-5-4-3
9. Aged milker 5 years and older6-5-4-3
10. Best senior doe.....Ribbon
(All of above animals must have freshened, including dry milkers)

DIVISION 49 - MARKET GOATS

If an exhibitor shows two animals and they fall into the same weight class, the second animal must be shown by another eligible junior exhibitor.

Market Animal Sale requirements are listed in a separate document. Market goats will be judged immediately following the market lamb classes on Friday. Premiums will not be paid on second entry animals.

Class No.

1. Kid (doe or wether) first entry.....5-4-3-2
2. Kid (doe or wether) second entry
3. Carcass kid (carcass placing determined by6-5-4-3
ultra sound scanning)

Additional Award

- First Place Carcass will receive \$25 cash

DIVISION 50 – SHOWMANSHIP (Goat)

Entry must be on entry blank. Exhibitors must show their own animals in showmanship classes. All goat showmanship classes will be held on Saturday. (Grade just completed.)

Class No. Premiums: \$3.00 - \$2.50 - \$2.00 - \$1.50

1. Grades 3-6
2. Grades 7-9
3. Grades 10 and above

Show a Goat Class – no pre-registration necessary.

This class is for any goat exhibitor, who is unable to show their own animal. They may show another exhibitor's animal.

DIVISION 51 – CART

Exhibitors in this class will have their goat trained to pull a cart.

Class No. Premiums: \$5.00 - \$4.00 - \$3.00 - \$2.00
