## **DEPARTMENT OC 105 – GOATS**

Entries must be made by July 31 of exhibit year. Judging will be on Sunday at approximately 2:30-3:00 pm, after Market Animal Sale.

- A junior kid is one born on or after April 1 of exhibit year.
- 2. A senior kid is one born during the period between January 1 to March 31 of exhibit year.
- 3. A junior yearling is one born during the period July 1 to December 31 of the year preceding exhibit year.
- 4. A senior yearling is a dry doe born before July 1 of the year preceding exhibit year and less than 24 months of age. The above does must never have freshened. Does that have freshened, including dry milkers shall be shown in the following classes. Does 24 months of age or over that have never freshened may not be shown. Age of following shall be determined as of the opening date of the fair.
- 5. A milking yearling, under 2 years.
- 6. Doe, two years old, over two years and under 3 years of age.
- 3-5 year old doe; is over three years and under 5 years of age.
- 8. An aged doe over five years.

An exhibitor's herd shall consist of one doe under one year, one yearling doe, and one doe 2 years or older, all owned by the same exhibitor.

A senior get-of-sire shall consist of 3 does which are the get of one sire, with at least one in milk. The animals need not be owned by the same exhibitor. All animals shall be from the senior age group of animals. A junior get-of-sire shall consist of three does under 2 years that have never freshened and are the get of one sire. The animals need not be owned by the same exhibitor.

A produce of dam shall consist of 2 does of any age which are the produce of one doe. The animals need not be owned by the same exhibitor.

Dam and daughter. The animals need not be owned by the same exhibitor.

All dairy goats need to be clipped for show. None can be shown with horns. Only Pygmy goats may be shown with horns and do not have to be clipped since they are not a dairy breed. Only does may be shown. No bucks may be shown.
