

Entries must be made by July 31 of exhibit year.

All entries must be from exhibit year's crop, except as noted.

Exhibitors are limited to a maximum of twenty-five (25) entries in Dept. 114. If more than 25 Dept. OC 114 entries are listed on the entry blank, only the first 25 will be entered into the computer. The remaining Dept. OC 114 entries will not be accepted. However, the exhibitor is only allowed to bring 20 exhibits in Dept. OC 114 to the fair to be judged.

Calumet County Master Gardeners will award \$10.00 to an outstanding exhibitor in the following areas:

- * Threshed Seed
- * Onions
- * Squash

DIVISION 435 – THRESHED SEED

Seed exhibit should be 3 quarts in size and exhibited in a gallon, clear plastic ziploc bag. All entries must be from exhibit year's crop except for soybeans, sunflowers, shelled corn, and milo/millet.

DIVISION 436 – CORN AND SUNFLOWERS

Sweet corn and sunflowers must have been harvested in exhibit year; field corn, popcorn, ornamental corn, and miniature corn should be from previous year.

The 3 corn stalks must be tripled tied. Corn and sunflower stalks should have roots removed.

Sunflower heads should have pollen capping removed.

Premiums: \$2.00–\$1.75–\$1.50–\$1.25

DIVISION 437 – HAY, HAYLAGE AND HIGH MOISTURE CORN

Exhibits must be grown in current season, selected, prepared and entered by exhibitor.

All hay must be cured; air-dried to a safe, storage moisture.

Slice of hay must be 2-4 inches in thickness and displayed in a clear plastic bag.

Corn silage, haylage and high moisture corn exhibit should be 3 quarts in size and exhibited in a one gallon, clear plastic ziploc bag.
